"THE ROLL OF THE BOOK"

Introduction

- 1. A Messianic Psalm
- 2. David is the shadow; Christ the substance
- 3. A mystical union between Christ and us

1. THE WAY WE ARE TO THINK OF RELIGIOUS ORDINANCES

- 1) v.6-8: Christ is addressing the Father here
- 2) The O.T. sacrifices how to view them:
 - i) "not desired" by God absolutely;
 - ii) but only relatively
- 3) In what regard "<u>not desired</u>"; yet, for all that, ordained by God till Christ came.
- 4) The <u>O.T. sacrifices</u>:
 - i) their origin in Genesis 3
 - ii) their appointment after Moses
 - iii) their abolition after Calvary
- 5) The <u>mistake</u> of carnal Jews shown by the prophets:

Isaiah 1:11-14; Amos 5:21-22; Psalm 51:16-17

APPLICATION:

- 1. O.T. ordinances relatively necessary
- 2. O.T. sacraments also

APPLICATION: Beware of leaning on them too much

2. WHAT ORDINANCES CANNOT DO CHRIST HAS DONE

1) "Then said I" (= Christ): Christ undertakes to do all that ordinances could not do.

- 2) "<u>Lo, I come</u>": Zeal, willing obedience to God's will moved <u>our</u> Saviour to do all that must be done to save the world.
- 3) "Ears opened": either
 - i) to be obedient to every demand of God
 - ii) "pierced" as the ear of a willing servant (Exodus 21:5)

 OBSERVE: Christ's obedience in life and death is the ransom.
- 4) <u>Christ willingly</u> did any and every action necessary for our eternal salvation.
- 5) "<u>Thy law…heart</u>": Christ is the one and only man to fulfil the Law to perfection. His life and death are both essential for eternal salvation.

APPLICATION: Ponder <u>Christ's cry</u>, "It is finished!"

3. THE ORIGIN OF ALL SALVATION AND GRACE

- 1) Christ here informs us of the <u>origin</u> of this saving purpose of God: "volume of the book..."
 - i) the eternal <u>Covenant of Redemption</u> between the Father and the Son.
 - ii) the <u>revelation of it</u> in the Bible, beginning with Genesis 3:15 and on.
- 2) This is <u>confirmed elsewhere</u> in scripture:

made necessary by the Fall.

- i) Hebrews 13:2: "blood...everlasting covenant"
- ii) 1 Peter 1:19-20: "Foreordained before the foundation of the world"
- iii) Titus 1:2: "promised before the world began"

 OBSERVE: God ordained man's remedy before it was

CONCLUSION

1. Do not make too much of ordinances and sacraments but of <u>Christ</u>. <u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: a wedding ring

2. Yet, do not despise God's ordinances but use them with an eye to <u>Christ</u>.
