1) v.16-21: interesting + important facts
2) The experiences at Thessalonica
3) Silas and Timothy awaited by Paul
4) Paul's compassion for the Athenians
5) Two venues:
(i) market
(ii) philosophers
6) Epicurians: Stoics (v.18)

APPLICATION: The world is lost, though so clever
2. THE SERMON OF PAUL: I

1) Its location: Areopagus (v.19)
2) The curiosity: Jesus + the resurrection
3) Paul's subject to start with:
(i) their ignorance of God
(ii) God the great Creator
(iii) the self-sufficiency of God
(iv) the sovereign wisdom of God
(v) the duty of all men to seek Him

OBSERVE: The first great need of ignorant men is to know about God first.

APPLICATION: Here is where to begin - the doctrine of God Himself

## 3. THE SERMON OF PAUL: II

1) God's "winking" at man's ignorance
2) "But now" (v.30): OT > NT
3) The fact of coming Judgement:
(i) all must appear before God
(ii) this event proved by the resurrection of Christ
(iii) Christ: the Judge
4) The appeal of Paul's sermon:
(i) the need to seek God
(ii) the glorious person of Christ

OBSERVE: A sermon is not a lecture - but calls for a decision

## 4. THE REACTION TO PAUL'S SERMON

1) It was mixed:
(i) many mocked - did not believe in miracles
(ii) but some believed
2) See how some postponed their duty "we will hear thee again"
3) Believing persons: of differing statures - yet all hear God's voice through Paul
OBSERVE: The gospel divides all who hear it
