# "RELIEF IN TEMPTATION"

### **Introduction**

- 1. The subject here is <u>Temptation</u>
- 2. A serious evil: Adam, Christ...
- 3. Temptations show us up for what we really are.

## 1. TEMPTATION IS A COMMON EXPERIENCE

- 1) There are <u>two</u> kinds of temptation:
  - (i) <u>afflictions</u>: ex. Abraham, Job, Christ...
  - (ii) seductions: ex. Adam, David, Joseph...
- 2) The <u>evil</u> of temptation: to drive into sin:
  - (i) Job's wife, Peter's denials Impatience, Fear
  - (ii) Disobedience lured into the trap: Judas
- 3) Compare two forms of pressure:
  - (i) the <u>wind</u> that blows hard + frightens
  - (ii) the <u>alluring</u> sound that offers delight

**APPLICATION**: The Christian must watch for both

# 2. THE APOSTLE GIVES HERE EXAMPLES OF IT

- 1) The importance of knowing the Bible well
- 2) Paul here draws out OT examples:
  - (i) Lusting after evil things (v.6)
  - (ii) Corrupt religion: lowering the standard of holiness
  - (iii) Fornication: **Illustration**: the Moabites
  - (iv) Tempting Christ: especially in a hard day
  - (v) Murmuring: the sin of complaining
- 3) The Bible is so vitally <u>necessary</u> as it shows us what to beware of

ILLUSTRATION: "Danger"

**APPLICATION**: All these temptations are very <u>real</u>

### 3. THE CHRISTIAN IS PROMISED HELP IN TEMPTATION

- 1) A wonderful <u>promise</u> to god's people:
  - (i) God is faithful: to look after believers
  - (ii) to moderate + soften the temptation
  - (iii) to "make a way to escape"

<u>OBSERVE</u>: The Christian will never be put in to a situation in which he is forced to <u>sin</u>

- 2) This expressed by Isaiah 27:8: "wind"
- 3) Compare the case of godless people:
  - (i) Pharaoh: saw miracles but was <u>hardened</u>
  - (ii) Saul: fell into <u>despair</u> no light
  - (iii) Judas: no deliverance in his plight

**APPLICATION**: Christian, this is a great promise

# 4. THIS TEACHING IS A GREAT HELP TO CHRISTIANS

- 1) God will never place the Christian in a <u>situation</u> in which he can only sin
- 2) In times of difficulty look up to God and <u>wait</u> for Him to help: "Wait on the Lord..."

**APPLICATION**: Never behave recklessly

3) When you are as in a prison-house, wait for God to open a <u>door</u> somewhere

**ILLUSTRATION**: Peter in Acts 12

4) <u>Avoid</u> placing yourself in temptations

APPLICATIONS: Remember: "Lead us not..."

# **CONCLUSION**:

- 1. Rejoice that "God is faithful"
- 2.Pray for grace to <u>resist</u> evil
- 3. Sadly, most people do not do so.
