Introduction

- 1. People are always interested in love
- 2. It is a sweet world especially God's love
- 3. No verse in the Bible is more full of gospel truth: memorise it!

1. THE LOVE OF GOD IS THE FOUNDATION OF ALL GOSPEL **BLESSING**

- 1) Love has its degrees:
 - i) love for that which is lovely -1^{st} degree
 - ii) love for that which is neutral -2^{nd} degree
 - iii) love for that which is $\overline{\text{repulsive}} 3^{\text{rd}}$ degree
- "The world" means mankind in its fallen state:
 - i) all have broken the first covenant
 - ii) all have trampled on God's laws
 - iii) all are by nature "haters of God"
- 3) God's love is
 - i) extreme
 - ii) undeserved
 - iii) amazing

APPLICATION: See what a great love God has!

THE SAVIOUR IS NONE OTHER THAN GOD'S OWN SON

- 1) There is a difference between "love" and love:
 - i) "love" is when men promise but do nothing
 - ii) love is shown when words are followed by actions **ILLUSTRATION**: The Parable of the Good Samaritan
- 2) God's love is shown by the immensity of the gift:
 - i) not some great man to help us
 - ii) not some great angel to assist us

iii) but God's own Son. Explain.

OBSERVE: A gift of infinite value proves God's love to be infinitely great

APPLICATION: Do you reverence Him? (The Parable)

3. SALVATION IS GOD'S GIFT TO ALL WHO BELIEVE

- 1) Two things here are extremely important:
 - i) "whosoever": not just the good / great / gifted **OBSERVE**: No one is excluded – no limits

APPLICATION: None too bad / old / young. You?

ii) "believeth": faith is the one thing needful – not saved by works / piety / prayer / character

OBSERVE: "By grace are ye saved by faith", etc.

- 2) The proper object of saving faith is Christ:
 - i) His person
 - ii) His work
 - iii) His death
 - iv) His glory
- 3) There is
 - i) notional faith in the head only
 - ii) saving faith in the heart also

APPLICATION: Saving faith changes our whole life

4. FAITH AND UNBELIEF HAVE ETERNAL CONSEQUENCES

- 1) There are only two kinds of persons
 - i) believers
 - ii) unbelievers. There is nothing in-between.
- 2) The consequences are the greatest possible:
 - i) believers: "eternal life" in glory
 - ii) unbelievers: "perish" in hell

OBSERVE: Can any of us afford to be unconverted?

- 3) The text is full of reasons to believe:
 - i) the greatness of God's love

- ii) the dreadfulness of Christ's sufferings
- iii) the freeness of this gospel offer
